Are you interested in helping to start a CHUMC softball team? The West Shore Churches Slowpitch Softball League has been in operation about 70 years. It is predominantly a male league from 16 years of age, but some churches have female players. They play about 26 games a season in Enola, Lemoyne, New Cumberland, Mechanicsburg and Fairview Township. Practice starts April 1; games run first Monday in May-last week in July. Teams play an average of two nights per week, most double headers. We use ASA Umpires. Games are seven innings and start at 6:00 p.m. Uniforms are not required, but some teams do have uniforms. CHUM league fee will cover cost of umpires, softballs, playing fields and liability insurance.
